

Border Super Star




Perfect as a class activity, decoration or topic resource!

Create a Super Star

You will need:

Borders - why not try some of





• Scissors - Tape or Glue - A Ruler *Optional: Jump ring and curling ribbon*

Directions:

Select 1 or 2 different borders (one for the star and one for the star centre). Trim off the scalloped edges if necessary, & glue the matching borders back to back so you have strips with 2-sided patterns.

For the Star:

Trim 1/2" off one end of the border. Then, accordion fold the trimmer into eleven 3 1/2" sections (Fig.1). The first sections is #1 and #11 together, and a star shape should appear (Fig.3).

For the Star Centre:

Trim the borders into 12". Accordion fold it into 6 x 2" sections. The first section is #1 and the last is #6. To create a hexagon shape, glue section #1 and #6 together (fig. 2). Tuck it into the middle of the star shape so that each side creates a triangle with each point of the star. Secure the two shapes together with glue or tape (Fig. 3)

Hanging Option:

Place a jump ring through the top point of the star and use curling ribbon to hang it.

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
